Having started with the details of the exact location of the site so that the emergency services can be told where they are required we start our assessment at the entrance to the How will this affect other road users? How are horses and pedestrians going to move about the site, take particular note of the start and finish of the rally? Access for first aid vehicles must also be considered at this stage, may only be for a NHS Trust ambulance to collect a casualty. Are there public rights of way, footpaths or bridleways across or at the boundary of the site? What action needs to be taken to stop a loose horse leaving the site and going onto a public road?	e site.
